## RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Judging will be held on Saturday September 28, 2019 beginning at 9:30 AM.
2. The seven dollar (\$7.00) IAS membership fee entitles the bearer to one admission ticket and the right to enter exhibits. **NO ENTRY FEE or IAS MEMBERSHIP** is required for Junior members (18 years of age and under) entering Junior Sections. However, if a Junior is entering an Adult/Open Section, then a membership is required and those entries **MUST** be on Adult/Open Entry Form.
3. Entries must be post marked by Wednesday September 18, 2019. Send entries to: Michael Becker, 71615 Bronson Line, RR 1, Dashwood ON N0M 1N0 or email entries to mike26ca@hotmail.com. **Make entries payable to Ilderton Agricultural Society.**
4. A \$9.00 fee will be charged for all Exhibitors that have not shown in 2018.
5. All entry fees must accompany entry forms.
6. Cages will be supplied for Large Fowl, Bantam, and Bantam Duck classes. Exhibitors showing Large Ducks, Geese, and Turkeys must supply their own cages. Classes may have to be doubled up.
7. In filling out the entry form, please use A for old male, B for old female, C for young male and D for young female along with class number and please print clearly. In all sections where AC, AOC, AV or AOV is specified, please name the variety, or breed and variety in AOV classes.
8. Any section where seven or more birds are entered for competition, the Secretary has the right to make an additional class.
9. Exhibitors may show as many entries in any class as they wish.
10. Entries will be accepted up to the capacity of the showroom. Priority will be given to members of the Great Lakes Poultry Association.
11. This will be a sanctioned American Poultry Association and American Bantam Association meet. To be eligible for APA and ABA awards, individuals must be paid members of the APA and ABA at the time of judging. All APA and ABA rules will apply.
12. The new revised Standard of Perfection shall be the guide of the judge.
13. In sections of classes where there are not two or more exhibits, the Judge shall be empowered to award a second, a third or no prize, where he considers the exhibit does not merit a first prize.
14. Any bird(s) showing signs of sickness will be removed from the showroom immediately. This will be strictly enforced.
15. Anyone wishing to enter the Youth Showmanship Competition must enter birds in the open Junior classes.
16. All individuals entering the Junior classes must be prepared to show proper proof of age if requested.
17. All reasonable precautions will be taken to protect property, however, the Great Lakes Poultry Association and the Ilderton Agricultural Society will not be held responsible for any losses.
18. Those in the Middlesex 4-H Poultry are welcome to enter the show and participate in the 4-H program at the fair.

Prize Money 1st, 2nd, 3rd – Rosettes by IAS

This year, we will be hosting APA-ABA Youth Showmanship. Please have entry forms in to the show secretary by Wednesday, September 18th. The exhibitor will show handling skills and knowledge in all areas of raising a small poultry flock according to his/her age level and their knowledge of the standard for their showmanship bird. A guideline of “suggested” knowledge for showmanship for each age group is available on the Youth Club website, [www.youthexhibitionpoultry.org](http://www.youthexhibitionpoultry.org). This is an event where the junior exhibitor demonstrates their bird handling and knowledge to the poultry judge. Anyone wishing to participate in this competition must already have entered birds in the Junior classes (Classes 700 to 717) and have paid the applicable entry fees.

**AGE GROUPS:** *The following three classes in showmanship will be recognized by the APA-ABA Youth Poultry Club.*

1. **Junior** (approximate ages 8 – 10)
2. **Intermediate** (approximate ages 11 – 13)
3. **Senior** (approximate ages 14 and up)

**DRESS CODE:** All exhibitors should be required to dress neatly for the showmanship class.

This class is a very public event and the exhibitors should be aware of this fact and show their best.

# Rules & Regulations

## **ATTENTION ALL EXHIBITORS: EVERYBODY PAYS**

**All persons entering the grounds must pay the admission fee.**

**There will be no exceptions.**

This applies to officials of the fair, employees, exhibitors, performers, concessionaires and fair visitors. Many years of experience at fairs in the United States and Canada with an "everyone pays" policy has proven to be reasonable and fair, and it has met with the co-operative approval of the fair-going public. Members will be admitted with a membership pass.

Admission by Exhibitor's pass will be allowed throughout the duration of the Fair.

1. \$7.00 constitutes membership and entitles the party to one admission ticket and the right to make entries. Juniors entering an Adult/Open Class **MUST** purchase a membership.
2. **JUNIORS** – All Junior exhibitors must fill in an entry form found on **page 59**. An exhibitor number is NOT required for Junior Classes.
3. Contact the committee chairperson if further information is required.
4. All stock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and must have been so at least thirty days prior to the show. All grain, fruits, flowers, vegetables, farm produce and dairy products must be the property of the exhibitor, grown in the present year and of his/her own farm or holding.
5. Exhibitors of pure bred stock must produce pedigree, if requested to do so. This rule will be strictly enforced. All entries are to be owned and registered in the name of the exhibitor.
6. No single entry will be allowed to be exhibited for two different prizes, except in the case of specials or if stated otherwise.
7. Exhibitors will be entitled to only one entry, per class, per section, except in livestock classes.
8. Animals must not travel faster than a walk outside the show ring.
9. Exhibitors of large animals including horses, cattle, sheep, swine and goats must provide proof of a minimum of two million dollars liability insurance indicating the policy number and expiry date.
10. All exhibits in the Homecraft Departments must be owned and made within the previous twelve months by the exhibitor.
11. **All ADULT and JUNIOR HOMECRAFT and 4-H LIFESKILLS class winners MUST pick up their prize winnings at the Fair Office in the Arena between 1:00 p.m. on Saturday and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.**
12. All exhibits (except Photography and Art) to be received Thursday, September 26 between 5:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. and Friday, September 27 between 9:30 a.m. and 12:00 noon, to be ready for judging promptly at 12:30 p.m. The arena will be closed while judging is in progress. **Photography and Art entries MUST be brought in Thursday, September 26 from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.**
13. Exhibitors are asked to have their name and exhibitor number (if required) on entry tags before arriving at the arena.
14. **NO EXHIBIT MAY BE REMOVED FROM THE HALL OR GROUNDS BEFORE 4:30 P.M., Sunday, September 29, 2019. ANYONE NOT ABIDING BY THIS RULE WILL FORFEIT THEIR PRIZE MONEY.**
15. **Due to Health Regulations, you may not sell your food exhibits while on the fairgrounds.**
16. All Judges are required to report to Fair Office before 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Friday and Saturday.
17. Judges have full power to place articles in their proper classes and to withhold prize money on account of inferiority.
18. Ties will be broken wherever possible. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
19. All protests must be in writing and must state plainly the cause of the complaint. The sum of \$5.00 must accompany a protest. The protest must be in the hands of the Secretary or President by 6:00 p.m., Sunday, September 29, 2019.
20. The following year's membership will be deducted from all prize winnings of \$9.00 or more.
21. While directors take every possible precaution to secure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, the owners of such articles take the risk of exhibiting.
22. The Ilderton Agricultural Society, its members, agents, employees, and volunteers shall not be liable for any loss of or damage to property belonging to an exhibitor or to a vendor however caused. The exhibitor or vendor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Ilderton Agricultural Society, its members, agents, employees, and volunteers for any claim or damage however caused, arising out of, or in consequence of, the use of the exhibition space allotted.
23. All Vendors must provide proof of liability insurance for 2 million indicating the policy number and the expiry date.
24. **While the Officers and Directors of this Society will use every available means to prevent accidents in and about the grounds, it must be strictly understood that all persons entering the show grounds must personally assume all risk of accident or injury from any cause whatsoever.**
