CHECK-IN

BIRDS MUST NOT BE REMOVED FROM YOUR VEHICLE OR PLACED INTO THEIR SHOW CAGES PRIOR TO CHECK-IN.

Upon arrival please go directly to check-in at the Event Secretary's table.

Birds may only be handled by the owner/exhibitor, working judge, or show staff.

THIS IS MANDATORY. ONLY HANDLE YOUR OWN BIRDS.

SECURITY

PNPA Event Staff will be monitoring the Event site. However, the primary responsibility for bird security continues to be with exhibitors. Be aware that **losses at poultry shows generally occur during coop-out**. It is the main reason that we do NOT allow early coop-out. Be on time for coop-out and remove your most valuable birds first. If you opt to zip tie or lock cage doors, make sure locks are removed before judging or your birds will be passed by. Judges and clerks are not authorized to remove them. Below are PNPA Security requirements:

1. Boxes and carriers transporting birds within the perimeters of the Clark County Fairgrounds during the event dates must be **marked with the owner's identification information**. The same standard applies to empty boxes and carriers that are stored in the event buildings during the event.
2. **The only people who may handle a bird is the exhibitor/owner**, show staff, or designated judge.
3. If you see someone handling or transporting a bird who is not the exhibitor/ owner, please immediately contact the building superintendent or assistant building superintendent. **Do NOT confront them** yourself.

RESTRICTED BIRDS: The following birds are restricted from ALL EVENTS, COMPETITIONS, AND SHOW AREAS, nor are they to be brought on-site at any time:

1. **Birds that have been vaccinated for any communicable illness (including ILT, Marek's, etc) within the last 60 days.**
2. **Birds that have been infected with any communicable illness (including ILT, Marek's, etc) within the last 60 days.**

HEALTH REGULATIONS:

Exhibitors should forward a copy of their NPIP paperwork with their entry form (if they have it). Any entries without NPIP paperwork are subject to blood testing by the WA State Vet.

DO NOT BRING RECENTLY VACCINATED (60 Days or less) BIRDS TO THE SHOW

GENERAL SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be **POST-MARKED BY FEBRUARY 15TH 2018.**

3. There are two separate Open Shows. Both will be governed by APA & ABA rules.

4. The PNPA is not responsible for awards donated by individuals or specialty clubs.

5. Each entry must fall into only one of the following divisions:

L = Large Fowl

G = Goose

B = Bantam

T = Turkey

D = Duck

GN = Guinea

6. Each entry must fall into only one of the following categories (note: Trios automatically get 2 holes, a third coop or hole will be an additional charge):

C = Cock, male over one year of age

H = Hen, female over one year of age

K = Cockerel, male under 1 year of age

P = Pullet, female under one year of age

YT = Young Trio (chickens only)

OT = Old Trio (chickens only)

7. It is the bird owner's responsibility to feed and water their birds. Do not feed or water birds belonging to another exhibitor.

8. Exhibitors of birds showing signs of disease or parasites will be expected to immediately remove them from the facility upon notification by PNPA Staff.

9. Evidence of faking will result in all of the exhibitor's entries barred from competition and entry fees forfeited.

10. No one shall handle birds except the bird's owner, the judge, or a member of the Event Staff.

11. Your participation constitutes your agreement to hold harmless the Pacific Northwest Poultry Association and the Clark County Fairgrounds from claims and losses.

12. The Show Committee will adjudicate issues not covered by the show rules. One of the Show Superintendents shall chair the committee.

13. Exhibitor's are subject to any parking fees the Clark County Event Center is collecting on show day. Due to concurrent events there is no free parking, and absolutely no parking in the loading dock area, violators WILL be towed at owner's expense.

SERAMA TABLE TOP



The Serama is the smallest breed of chicken currently recognized in the Standard. These multicolored birds are originally from Malaysia where they are shown on the table top.

Seramas at this TT show will be judged by SCNA rules.

1. White and Black American Seramas are currently the only recognized varieties in the APA/ABA Standard. Exchequer, Blue or other varieties that are anticipated to have APA/ABA approval in the near future, should be entered in either the OPEN shows (double shows) where they will be displayed in the main show areas and cage judged. They may also show TT. Please complete the show entry form in full for these birds. Seramas entered in Open shows MAY NOT be entered in Table Top competition and MUST follow all rules applicable to those shows.

2. All other Varieties of Serama will be Table Top judged. Traditional, Ayam, frizzled and silkied. The show entry form for TT Seramas should be entered as follows:

Breed – “Serama - Table Top”.

Sex – “Cock/Cockerel/Hen/Pullet”

Entries in description field are for exhibitor’s benefit only! We will also offer a Prospect Class. This class is for young birds of any sex 2 months to 6 months that you would like evaluated and judged. TT fee is \$5.00 per bird unless otherwise noted. Exhibitor fee of \$5.00 must be paid in all cases. The bird’s leg band number must be shown on the entry form. Once entered and paid, there are no refunds.

3. Leg band numbers are required in order to keep Table Top competition in order.

Hands off judging will be used, in accordance with the SCNA adopted procedures. More information here: <http://www.scnaonline.org/standards-and-judging.html>. Do not interrupt, converse with the judge or officials, or interfere in any way during the TT judging. Limit conversations with others to areas away from the TT judging. Questions or concerns during the TT Show should be directed to the Serama Show Superintendent.

ONLY BIRDS ENTERED IN THIS SPECIFIC TT COMPETITION ARE ALLOWED AT THE SERAMA TT SHOW AREA ! Do not bring other birds into the TT judging section either from your crates or cages etc. or from the Sale Area. For the breed standards, and judging criteria, please go to the website above.

APA Egg Competition Judging Criteria

1. Shell Color: 6 point possible. Does shell color conform to APA breed standard? This is not applicable of eggs from mixed ancestry.
2. Shape: 3 points possible. Are they too elongated, too small, too rounded?
3. Texture: 2 points possible.
 - Matte – 0 points
 - Satin – 1 point (Shell should feel smooth to the touch all over).
 - Bright – 2 points (Bloom and appearance will only be present with freshness).
4. Uniformity: 3 points possible. How closely do eggs match each other?

Total possible points – 14 In case of ties, judging becomes more detailed.

APA National Egg Show Rules

An Egg Show Champion will be chosen from the top eggs in each class of the main egg competition.

Main Egg Competition

- One entry consists of a group of 3 eggs.
- Judging Criteria: Shell color (when breed standard has stated color, variation from this is penalized), Shape, Texture, Uniformity.
- Entries shall note the breed of eggs, non standard (not recognized by APA), mix or unknown ancestry.

Divisions

- Large Eggs –Breed, Non-Standard or mix noted on entry card. Classes: White, Brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

- Bantam Eggs –Breed or Non-Standard noted on entry card. Classes: White, Brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).
- Waterfowl eggs –Breed or Non-Standard noted on entry card. Classes: White, brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).
- All Other Eggs –Emu, Turkey, etc. Classes: White, brown, or other colors (speckled or mottled entered by background color).

Painted Egg Competition

- 1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.
- Egg must be hard boiled or blown.
- Egg is painted or inked. NO adornment or decorations added.
- Some type of upright support recommended.
- Egg must be painted/inked by exhibitor.

Decorated Egg Completion

- 1 egg consists of one entry. Multiple entries accepted.
- Egg must be hard boiled or blown.
- Egg is to be adorned or decorated, but may have paint added.
- Outline of egg must be recognizable.
- Egg decoration must be created by the exhibitor.

Exhibitors in egg competition are NOT required to enter birds. They may enter in egg competition only. There is an entry fee charge of \$3 for each entry.

All wins in Classes of 100 or more will be denoted with a star * and be retained in the ABA records to accumulate towards the Master Exhibitor, Master Breeder, and Lifetime Achievement awards. Only ABA members are eligible to compete for the above awards.

Dues are \$20.00 per year \$50.00 for three years. New members receive a copy of the quarterly and the latest available copy of the Annual American Bantam Association Year Book which lists many advertisers and includes a complete breed and variety index. Winners of ABA awards are listed in the year book under Who's Who in Bantams.

Starred wins are earned in classes of 100 or more in the following:

- Champions and Reserve Champions in the seven bantam divisions.
- Best and Reserve of Breed and Variety.
- Best Display when 7 or more bantam displays are shown
- Best and Reserve Display when 10 or more bantam displays are shown.
- Best and Reserve Trio when 30 or more trios are shown by 4 or more exhibitors.

A single bird is eligible for only one award and can earn only one starred win.
